



## **Emory at Grady Team-Based Award**

The Emory at Grady Team-Based Award has been established by the Emory at Grady Award Committee to recognize teams (of at least 3-4 members) of faculty and/or staff committed to a common purpose or goal towards advancing the mission and vision of the Emory School of Medicine.

**Deadline:** Nominations will be accepted through **August 8, 2025**.

**Eligibility:** At least one current Emory faculty member must be part of the team. Teams can consist of employees from more than one institution (Emory, Morehouse, or Grady). All current Emory faculty with at least 50% of their clinical, teaching, or research effort on the Grady campus are eligible. Nominees will have exhibited extraordinary efforts in team-based impact for patients, families, communities, and trainees at the local, regional, and/or national level.

Examples include but are not limited to:

- Multidisciplinary teams created to tackle an important clinical problem (including more than one specialty)
- Consistent demonstration of a cooperative and positive attitude in clinical teams
- Creation of teams to engage in successful research
- Teams that promote an inclusive culture at Grady or the communities served by Grady

**Nominations:** The team must be nominated by a faculty or staff member or a trainee of Emory School of Medicine, Morehouse School of Medicine, or Grady Memorial Hospital. The nomination should consist of a concise narrative (500 words or less) describing the nominee's impact and the effect these actions have had.

**Submission:** Must be submitted using the [Online Nomination Form](#) and include the following:

- Nominating letter (500 words or less)
- Evidence of teamwork (i.e., brochure, publication, article, media, website)

**Decision:** Will be made by a subcommittee of the Emory at Grady Faculty Development Committee.

**Award:** The recipient of the Emory at Grady Team-Based Award will be announced and honored at the annual Emory at Grady Awards reception.
