Upon Successful Completion of the Emory Anesthesiologist Assistant Program, students will be able to:

- 1. Demonstrate comprehensive knowledge of human anatomy, physiology, pathophysiology and pharmacology as they relate to anesthesia care.
- 2. Perform a comprehensive history and physical exam on patients of all ages and develop an anesthesia care plan under the supervision of an anesthesiologist.
- 3. Safely and effectively assist with the administration of general, regional and local anesthesia using appropriate monitors, airway and procedural techniques.
- 4. Appropriately assess and manage peri-operative patients, recognizing and responding to emergent situations as directed by an anesthesiologist.
- 5. Effectively communicate with patients, families, surgeons and other healthcare providers to coordinate care.
- 6. Exhibit professional behaviors, uphold ethical standards of care and comply with all legal and regulatory requirements for anesthesiologist assistants.
- 7. Demonstrate skills in critical thinking, problem-solving, clinical decision making and continuous quality improvement to provide optimal patient care.
- 8. Maintain accurate medical records and billing documentation according to practice guidelines.
- 9. Continually expand knowledge and clinical skills through self-directed learning and participation in ongoing certification and training requirements.
