The opioid epidemic is not going away. Our goal is to provide education, and to be a resource for our ED colleagues who are on the front lines. REAL TTIME is the first step to creating a sustainable, statewide outpatient referral network that will help patients with opioid use disorder get the care they need in your community. We want to decrease the burden of the opioid epidemic in your ED by providing assistance for your patients and decreasing the work required by your ED staff to assist patients with opioid use disorder.



REAL TTIME Data

36 Patients

- 29% of providers consulted Georgia Poison Center
- 86% of patients connected to a peer recovery coach in the ED
- 52% of patients still engaged with RCO at 7 days
- 42% of patients still engaged with RCO at 30 day

About Jocelyn Wallace

Jocelyn Wallace is the Founder and Executive Director of Never Alone Clubhouse. Since March 2017, Jocelyn has been in long-term recovery. Although she had been to treatment many times before, that time was different. She went to a peer-led organization where Jocelyn shared, "it changed that blanket of guilt, shame, and remorse I had been carrying." The person sitting across from Jocelyn shared some of the same experiences and encouraged her to make the best decisions for herself. That experience made a profound impact on Jocelyn's chance for recovery. Jocelyn experience inspired her to open Never Alone Clubhouse.
