#### Welcome Dr. Dionysios "Dio" Kavalieratos!

Dr. Kavalieratos is a health services researcher whose work focuses on models of palliative care delivery in serious chronic illness. He has expertise in qualitative and mixed methods, clinical trials, complex behavioral interventions,

implementation science, and evidence synthesis. He completed his Ph.D. in Health Policy & Management at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill in 2013.

Dr. Kavalieratos received the 2019 Early Career Investigator Award from the American Academy of Hospice and Palliative Medicine (AAHPM), the first non-physician to ever receive this honor. Dr. Kavalieratos holds several leadership roles related to palliative care research, including Chair of the AAHPM's Scientific Subcommittee. member of the Palliative Care Research Cooperative's Scientific Review Committee, and Co-Director of Palliative Care Initiatives at the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation. Dr. Kavalieratos' work has been supported by a variety of federal and private organizations, such as the National Palliative Care Research Center, AHRQ, NHLBI, and the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation. His research has appeared in journals such as JAMA, the Journal of the American College of Cardiology, the Journal of the American Heart Association, among others. Dr. Kavalieratos is an Associate Editor of the *Journal of Palliative Medicine* and of Palliative Medicine Reports. We are excited to welcome him to the Department and look forward to future work together!

## Mascaro wins CTSA Best Oral Presentation


**Dr. Jennifer Mascaro** was awarded Best Oral Presentation at the Southeast Regional Clinical and Translational Science Conference at

Keynote Speaker: Tabia Henry Akintobi, PhD, MPH Morehouse School of Medicine

Tabia Henry Akintobi, PhD, MPH is Associate Professor of Community Health and Preventive Medicine, Associate Dean of Community Engagement, and Principal Investigator and Director of the Prevention Research Center at Morehouse. She earned both an MPH and PhD in Public Health from the University of South Florida's College of Public Health. Dr. Akintobi's local, national and global clinical and translational research, training, and service initiatives address social and public health disparities and advancing health equity. She is also involved in the Atlanta Clinical and Translational Institute Community Engagement and Research Program and the Exploratory Center of Excellence on Health Disparities, where she leads community engagement key functions central to ensuring bi-directional research translation between communities and academic researchers.






