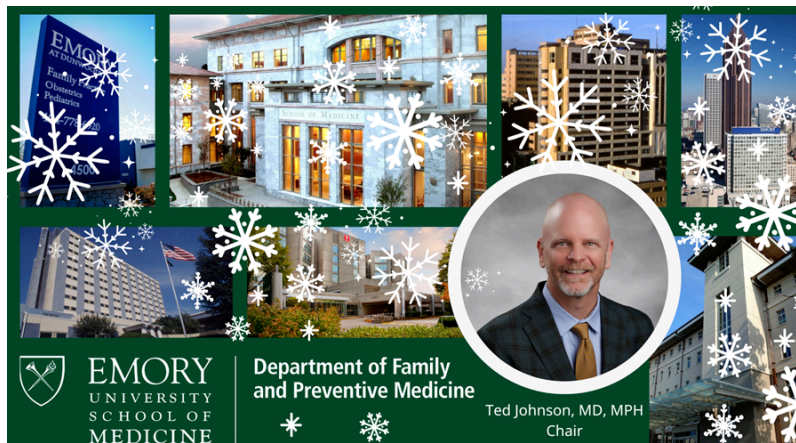
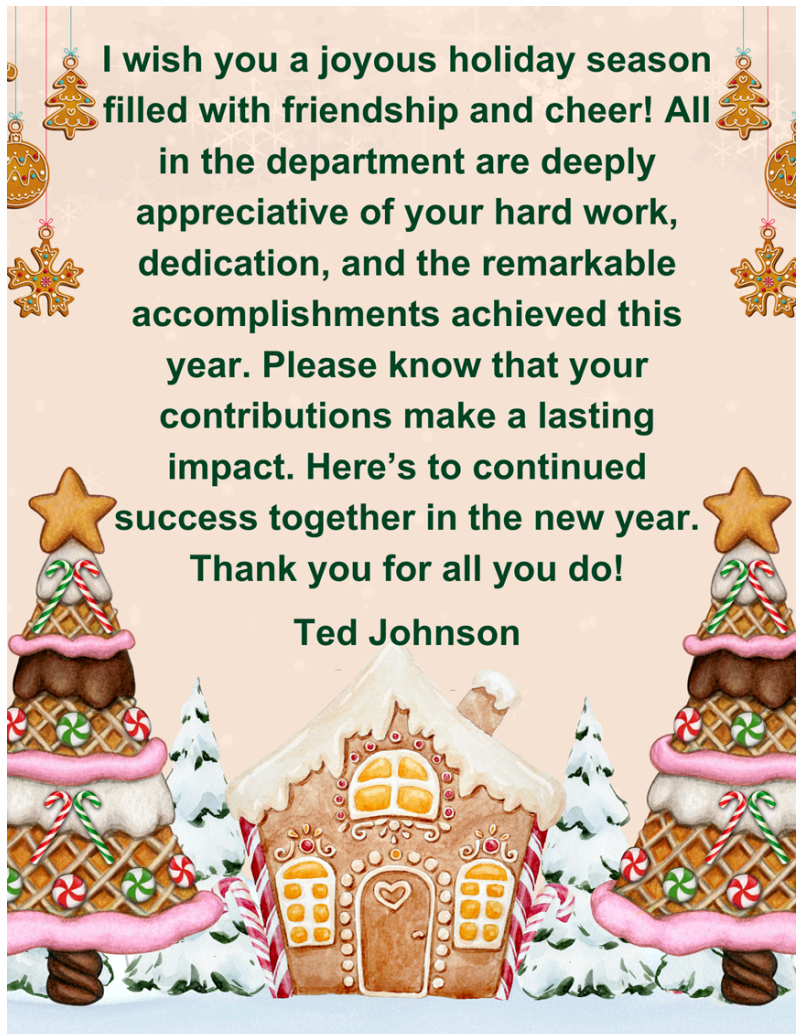




Dear Family Medicine Faculty and Staff,
