## **Choose VA for the Benefits**

The Specialty Education Loan Repayment Program (SELRP) allows VA to recruit physicians starting or currently enrolled in residency training, in medical specialties for which VA had determined hard-to-recruit and meet forecasted workforce projections. Selected participants may receive up to **\$40,000** in education loan repayment for each year for up to four years, totaling \$160,000. SELRP recipients agree to a minimum service obligation of 2-4 years as a full-time patient care provider at a VA health care facility.

## **Eligible Applicants**

- Must be a US citizen
- Recently graduated from an accredited medical or osteopathic school and matched or pending a match into an accredited residency program in a VHA designated specialty.
- At least 2 years remaining in your VHA designated residency/fellowship.
- Owes any amount of principal or interest on a qualifying loan which was used to pay costs relating to a course of education or training which led to a MD/DO degree in medicine.
- Covered Costs: Tuition expenses; and all other reasonable expenses, including expenses for fees, books, equipment, and laboratory expenses, and reasonable living expenses.
