Outstanding Publication Awards in Basic and Clinical/Translational Research

This award recognizes Department of Medicine (DOM) investigators who have produced outstanding **basic or clinical/ translational** research publications (including **quality improvement** and **health services**) within the last year. A basic award and a clinical/translational research award will be given in each of three faculty ranks:

- Instructor/Assistant Professor
- Associate Professor
- Professor

Deadline: The deadline for all faculty awards nominations is **June 24, 2024**

<u>Eligibility:</u> All regular, full- or part-time Instructors, Assistant Professors, Associate Professors, and Professors with a primary appointment in the DOM of Emory University are eligible unless they received this award during the previous 3 years. The Nominee must be a first or last author, except for multi-site clinical trials, where the nominee may be the site PI or hold a position on the development, steering, or writing committee.

Nominations: Nominators must submit a peer-reviewed original research article published between **May 1, 2023 and April 30, 2024.** Only one entry/publication per nominee will be accepted for review. For both basic and clinical/translational research awards, a significant portion of data acquisition must have been performed at Emory and/or its affiliates. Nominations can be self-made or made by other eligible faculty. Nomination for this award does <u>not</u> preclude nomination for other DOM awards in the same year.

Submission:

- Narrative must address the following: (5,000-character limit)
 - o impact of research
 - o novelty of research
 - o the role of the nominee
 - description of the work performed at Emory
- If the submission is part of a multi-site clinical trial, please explain the nominee's specific contribution to the success of the publication.
- Include a copy of the manuscript in PDF.
- Manuscripts will be judged on impact and the more universal standards of adherence to scientific method, clarity of writing, quality of methods and statistics, and significance of results.
