We should also celebrate new leadership opportunities and clinical distinctions within our division that we feature throughout the rest of this newsletter!


I hope each of us will share celebrations and victories both small and large. It is those positives that will sustain us.





EBM Corner: by Youssef Saklawi, MD

In my short career as a hospitalist, I have yet to meet 2 clinicians who diagnose iron deficiency the same way.

Current anemia thresholds do not always reflect true pathology: "normal" for women and "low" for men are based on population averages, not on iron status [1]. As a result, nearly 40% of menstruating women with hemoglobin in the "normal" range may still be iron deficient and symptomatic [2]. Supplementing women in this range with oral iron has been shown to increase hemoglobin [3].



Diagnosing iron deficiency remains challenging, especially in hospitalized patients.


Ferritin <45 ng/mL is specific for iron deficiency, but as an acute-phase reactant that rises with inflammation & age, it is not sensitive. Patients may have elevated ferritin levels & still be iron deficient. Transferrin saturation (TSAT) can be used as an adjunct in those scenarios.

TSAT <16% or <20% with inflammation suggests functional iron deficiency [4]. Unfortunately, TSAT has not consistently outperformed ferritin as a biomarker for iron deficiency [5].

Practice Pattern: In suspected iron deficiency, I use ferritin and TSAT, recognizing current tests are imperfect and that high ferritin does not reliably rule out iron deficiency.

Application: Hospitalists routinely use ferritin and TSAT in patients with heart failure. In this group, IV iron for ferritin <100 or <300 ng/mL with TSAT <20% improved quality of life [6], though newer data show no effect on hospitalizations or mortality [7].

As a SADE, I get to hear about and share projects, lectures, and resources.
