Available Research Resources to support FAME awardees

<u>DOM Data Analytics and Biostatistics (DAB) Core</u> provides high-quality biostatistics and IT Data management services to investigators in Department of Medicine by leveraging existing services in the Rollins School of Public Health and the Information Technology Department. For DOM investigators, DAB Core offers **10 hours of services at no charge**; however, the requestee is responsible for service that exceeds 10 hours.

<u>Emory Institutional Review Board (IRB)</u> is responsible for reviewing and approving *human subjects research* and FDA-regulated *clinical investigations* to ensure that they are conducted in accordance with applicable federal regulations and institutional policies. If you are unsure whether your project needs IRB approval, see their engagement determination checklist.

<u>Emory Facilities and Resources Boilerplate Language Library</u> is a centralized resource of up-todate language describing facilities and resources available at Emory. These descriptions are useful for grant applications. The Department of Medicine Strategic Advisory for Research Team (StART) has contributed to the library descriptions of cores, resources, facilities, and equipment in the DOM.

<u>i2b2</u> allows you to query, free of charge, electronic health record data at Emory Healthcare that might be relevant to your project (e.g. number of patients, aggregate information for a diagnosis). It is operated and funded by <u>Emory's Clinical and Translational Science Award (CTSA) program in partnership with the Office of Information Technology (OIT) and the <u>Department of Biomedical Informatics</u>.</u>

<u>Institute for Healthcare Improvement's</u> *QI Essentials Toolkit* includes the tools and templates you need to launch a successful quality improvement project and manage performance improvement.

REDCap is a secure, internally hosted web-based application designed exclusively to support data capture for research studies. To get help building your REDCap survey/database, please complete a DAB Core request. If your project is research based, then the service is free; if not, there is a \$25/month fee.

Road 2 NEXt success (R2NEXUS) workshop series is a program for junior faculty who have been either awarded a career development grant or whose award for a career development grant is pending. The program features quarterly workshops on research program and career development. The workshops offer a unique opportunity for peer-to-peer networking and building relationships with other talented new investigators. In addition, attendees will receive standardized information on career development that supplements the advice and direction received from the career development award mentor(s).

Rollins Earn and Learn (REAL) is a program funded by Rollins that offers full-time MPH/MSPH students at no cost to requesting Pls. This program provides the students with valuable opportunities to earn while they learn through applied public health experiences in real-world settings.

<u>Qualtrics</u> is available to current SOM faculty, staff, and students (at no additional cost) to build and distribute online surveys, analyze, and report on results, and collaborate with colleagues in real-time, through an easy-to-navigate web-based interface.
