INNOVATIVE RESEARCH SHARED DURING HEALTH SERVICES RESEARCH DAY

The 11th Annual Health Services Research (HSR) Day, hosted by Georgia CTSA and the Emory Health Services Research Center, brought together over 160 researchers, faculty, staff, and trainees from across Georgia at Emory's Rollins School of Public Health. The event provided a vibrant platform to showcase health services research focused on healthcare quality, effectiveness, and value through featured talks, rapid-fire presentations, poster sessions, and a career panel.

Keynote speaker Jennifer DeVoe, MD, DPhil, from Oregon Health & Science University, delivered an inspiring presentation on the role of primary care research in improving system effectiveness and addressing disparities. Additional featured talks included Wilbur A. Lam, MD, PhD, on point-of-care diagnostics and Amaka Eneanya, MD, MPH, on health system transformation in nephrology.

Reflecting on the event, 2025 HSR Day Chair Jessica Harding, PhD, noted:

Co-Chair Ambar Kulshreshtha, MD, added:



FALL 2025 & SPRING 2026



The Health Services Research (HSR) Center at Emory is seeking a highly motivated MPH student to join as a Research Assistant for the 2025–2026 academic year. This REAL-funded position offers hands-on experience in both qualitative and quantitative research, with a strong focus on health equity, kidney failure, transplant access, and health system improvement.

About the HSR Center:

The HSR Center supports studies that enhance healthcare systems to ensure high quality, value-based care and optimal patient outcomes. Our work informs both institutional change at Emory and broader national models.

Research Focus Areas Include:

- Disparities in access to kidney transplant (Dr. Harding)
- Psychosocial barriers and transition experiences in kidney failure care (Dr. Urbanski)
- Ethics and decision-making in clinical care (Dr. Dickert)

Key Responsibilities:

- Support HSR Center communications (reports, website updates, seminar coordination)
- Assist with IRB protocols and data use agreements
- Contribute to manuscript and grant preparation
- Perform quantitative and qualitative data analysis
- Participate in planning the Southeastern Kidney Transplant (SEKT) Coalition meeting
- Attend regular project meetings (in-person and virtual)

This position offers the opportunity to pursue a **practicum or thesis** with the HSR Center during your second year.
