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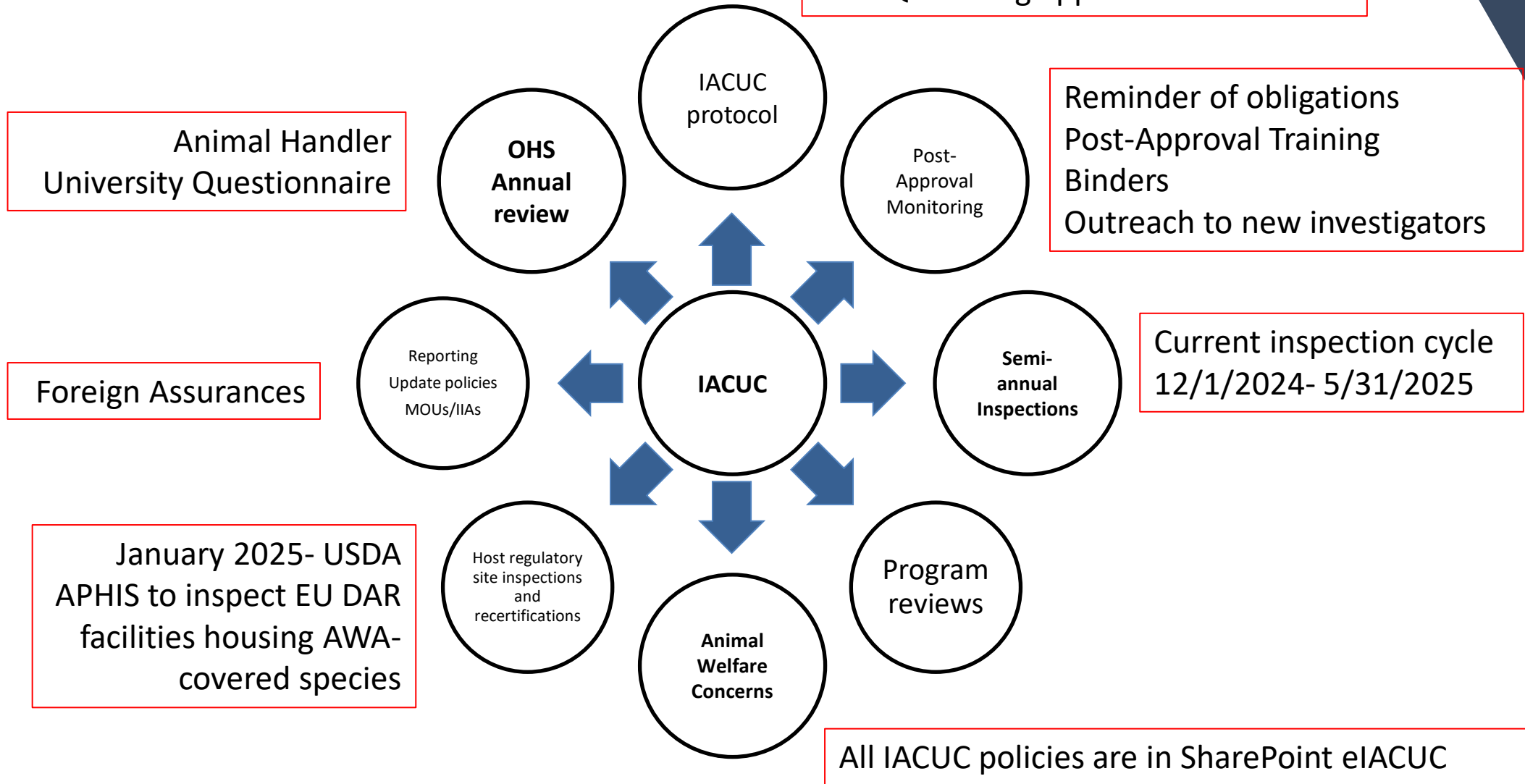

Address micro-hurdles included in the Ease of Research Survey

Micro-hurdle	Current action
Protocol Review	
Inconsistent	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> >Guidance document for submission of new and triennial protocols. It is OK to cite this if reviewer question is outside the guidance. >Training of reviewers
Too picky	>The RPA supports the research teams to ensure that information needed is included, this is done mainly during the pre-submission
Changes to unrelated sections of a protocol when an amendment is submitted.	>Generally, the review of an amendment is limited to the amendment itself. However, there are a few exceptions.
Timeliness	
Overall review time is long	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> >The IACUC office monitors review times and review cycles >Encourage use of standard procedures
Onboarding of new personnel is long	>The IACUC office created two guidance documents for training and the onboarding process [SharePoint site]
IACUC Program	
IACUC wants things done their way	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> >IACUC policies are reviewed every three years or as often as necessary to ensure that reflect current practices and regulation >Encourage meeting with the veterinary staff to discuss experiments >IACUC is reviewing the policy that includes demerit points

Upcoming changes to IACUC

- Micro-hurdle: submission site is unwieldy, approvals take forever, and regulations are too stringent.

The protocol software, eIACUC, is included in the transition to Insight.

- Discovery starts in January 2025
- Expected go-live is Summer of 2026
