SGIM President's Podcast




Hosted by SGIM President **Dr. Jada Bussey-Jones**, the SGIM *President's Podcast* will feature insights



New MedEd Funding for GIM Project



Dr. Robin Klein and **Dr. Jada-Bussey-Jones** received a National Board of Medical Examiners Innovators Grant for a project titled "Assessing the Assessors: Development and Implementation of a Faculty Assessment Dashboard to enable Valid and Equitable Assessment."

The project evaluates how faculty assess learner performance in clinical rotations. This is important as increasing evidence shows gender and racial disparities in faculty assessments of learners suggesting bias. With this dashboard, faculty can see how they rate and assess learners in various domains and how they compare to their peers and what is expected of them by the training program. The dashboard will help identify individual patterns in assessment that may indicate bias.



Announcement from AIM Center Director, Dr. David Roberts

Dr. Ted Johnson, MD, MPH, has assumed the role of Co-Director of the Emory <u>Academic Internal Medicine (AIM) Center</u> as of February 15, 2025 with a focus on Phase 2 of the AIM Center. Established through a \$16.5M gift from the Rollins Family Foundations and other donors, the AIM Center initially provided faculty development support at select Emory TEC GIM sites. With its success, an

additional \$26M gift is now expanding AIM's reach across the entire GIM Division, including Emory Clinic GIM, Grady GIM, and the Atlanta VA. This funding will support pilot grants, education, research, and three new endowed professorships, including two rotating Rollins Faculty Development Professorships.

Dr. Johnson's 13-year leadership as Division Director and deep understanding of faculty and programs make him exceptionally suited to co-lead AIM Phase 2. His experience will be instrumental in ensuring the center's continued impact, and I am thrilled he has accepted this role. 
