Pregnancy and COVID 19 Vaccination

• ACOG encourages its members to enthusiastically recommend vaccination to their patients. This means emphasizing the known safety of the vaccines and the increased risk of severe complications associated with COVID-19 infection, including death, during pregnancy," said J. Martin Tucker, MD, FACOG, president of ACOG.

Why the hesitancy?

- Systemic exclusion of pregnant patients from vaccination research has led to an implied concern of risk to mother and fetus
 - Pregnancy was a required exclusion from trials by the FDA until 1996 with little exception
- Misunderstanding of how genetic material is utilized in new vaccinations and carriers
- Lack of understanding of disease risk versus risk of vaccination

Ongoing monitoring systems

- VAERS
- V-Safe: >5000 participants Sept, 2021
- MOMI-Vax
- VSD
 - Weekly counts and rates of COVID-19 vaccination in pregnant people
 - Miscarriage and stillbirth that occurs among people who received COVID-19 vaccine during pregnancy
 - Adverse outcomes in pregnancy following COVID-19 vaccination, including:
 - Pregnancy complications
 - Birth outcomes
 - Infant outcomes for the first year of life (includes infant death, birth defects, and developmental disorders)

Side Note

- Are there vaccinations not recommended in Pregnancy?
 - Yes
- What do they have in common?
 - Some live or live attenuated vaccines
 - There are exceptions (TDaP)
- Have there been data fetal developmental problems from vaccines?
 - Interesting question...
