## Course Description

Critical care is one of the most resource-intensive areas in U.S. healthcare and one where the quality of healthcare delivery is known to vary significantly despite substantial medical advances in the past decade. This symposium will provide targeted education for common critical care conditions and procedures to multi-professional healthcare stakeholders. This program uses interactive and case-based lectures from stakeholders at all levels (physicians, nurses, NP and PA providers, pharmacists, and respiratory therapy personnel as well as administrators), and hands-on teaching in breakout sessions.
