

Dr. Tari A. King Joins Emory Department of Surgery

Tari King, MD, has been appointed as chief surgical officer for the cancer service line at Winship Cancer Institute of Emory University and Emory Healthcare. She will also serve as chief of the newly formed Division of Breast Surgery in the Department of Surgery at Emory University School of Medicine and as co-director of Winship's Glenn Family Breast Center. Dr. King will begin her tenure at Emory on July 14.

Dr. King currently serves as the Anne E. Dyson Professor of Surgery in the Field of Women's Cancers at Harvard Medical School and chief of the Division of Breast Surgery and vice chair of multidisciplinary oncology in the Department of Surgery at Brigham and Women's Hospital.

Dr. Lowe received the SSO Young Investigator Award for his study, "Evaluation of FcyRIIB as a Novel T cell Inhibitor in Cutaneous Melanoma" in 2018. The work examines the benefits of blocking FcyRIIB's ability to alter T cell responses.

Dr. Joshua Chan Receives Georgia CTSA KL2 Pilot Grant

Joshua Chan, MD, FACS, has been awarded a KL2 Pilot Grant from the Georgia Clinical & Translational Science Alliance (CTSA).

Dr. Chan was awarded \$50,000 for his project titled "Disparities In Health-Related Quality Of Life Following Left Ventricular Assist Device (LVAD) Implantation: Mitigating Individual and Social Determinants."

The Pilot Grants program promotes new networks of multidisciplinary and inter-institutional research teams and enhances currently available resources from each Georgia CTSA partner by investing in new clinical and translational research paradigms, encouraging young faculty to develop cutting-edge science, and becoming the glue that cements investigators and projects across the research consortium.



Dr. Joshua Chan Receives Individual Seed Grant Funded by Former Falcons Quarterback



Dr. David Rhoiney Receives Presidential Meritorious Service Medal


