The mission of the SSO is to improve multidisciplinary patient care by advancing the science, education and practice of cancer surgery worldwide.




## EJC Hospital Showcases New ION Non-Surgical Robot for Detection of Lung Cancer

Emory Johns Creek Hospital recently introduced its newest non-surgical robot, called ION. The ION bronchoscopy system by Intuitive uses minimally invasive fiberoptic technology to allow clinicians to biopsy lung nodules that may be suspicious for lung cancer.

Rachel Medbery, MD, an assistant professor for the Division of Cardiothoracic Surgery, stated that early detection is key to improving patient outcomes. "The ION allows doctors to safely and accurately biopsy small nodules from within the airways of the lung. If lung cancer can be caught early and then removed, many patients do not need chemotherapy and will remain cancer free for a long time."


#### **NEW FACULTY**


