


Call for Abstracts: 2026 William C. Wood Research Symposium

The 2026 Symposium will be held on Thursday, April 30, 2026. The deadline for submissions is Friday, February 6, 2026.




14th Annual Winship Cancer Institute Gastrointestinal Cancer Symposium

Emory Burn Surgery Subtrack Approved by AAST

The Emory burns surgery subtrack has been officially approved by the American Association for the Surgery of Trauma (AAST). The burn surgery subtrack is sponsored in conjunction with the American Burn Association and any participating Emory ACS fellow will receive a certificate upon completion of the fellowship.

With the approval from the AAST, Emory has officially become the first burns subtrack in the country.




Emory Healthcare Surgeons Complete First Patient Case in ARISE III Clinical Trial

Drs. Leshnower, Duwayri, and Zurcher completed the first patient case in the ARISE III clinical trial to treat a life-threatening heart condition, called acute type A aortic dissection, using an investigational ascending stent graft. The minimally invasive procedure is considered more suitable for higher risk populations versus an open-heart surgery to repair the dissection or tear.

The ARISE III trial is a prospective, multicenter, non-randomized pivotal study approved by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) to assess the safety and effectiveness of the investigational Gore Ascending Stent Graft in patients with acute Type A aortic dissections who are considered high risk for conventional surgery.


Dr. Benjamin joined Emory in 2020 and currently serves as a professor of surgery and the trauma medical director at Grady Memorial Hospital.




Division of Breast Surgery Announces New Advanced Practice Providers


Lacey King, PA


Megan Luedtke, PA-C


McKenzie Webster, DMSc, PA-C




Dr. Victoria Teodorescu Chosen as ASDIN's 2026 Beathard Award Recipient

The mission of ASDIN is to promote excellence in dialysis access care to improve outcomes for patients with kidney disease.




Mateo Villa, MD
